I can only speak for Ealing where I do have the responsibility and detailed knowledge of our finances and on that basis believe it is prudent and sensible to commit to keep Council Tax low and freeze it for a fifth consecutive year in 2015/16. What is not prudent or sensible is the Conservative position in Ealing which is to make lots of un-costed promises that can only be implemented by slashing services and closing community facilities given the further huge round of cuts that the Council will have inflicted on it by the Conservative led government over the next four years.

These figures describe the outcomes for cases where noise was the only aspect of the complaint. They do not include outcomes where noise was only one facet of a complaint (e.g. Anti-social behaviour, where combined action would have been taken under other legislation).

Action may also be taken by other agencies (e.g. social landlords to enforce the terms of their tenancies based upon evidence provided by the Councils noise team).

		<p>As of April 2014 Public Safety Control Room has access to 613 cameras</p> <p>There are also currently 14 Stand Alone Camera systems or “mobiles” which are redeployed around the borough.</p> <p>In total there are 627 cameras used by Public Safety CCTV (Safer Communities) – Other departments (including Parking Services) will have more.</p> <p>By comparison, the public space Control Room had access to 409 cameras in 2010. The additional cameras have resulted from shared agreements with TfL and Parking Services and cameras which have been added to the network through investment and partnership opportunities (e.g. Windmill Park agreement with Catalyst Housing).</p>
19.	Costello	How many CCTV cars are operating in the Borough and how many instances of traffic violations have they recorded over the past 2 years?
		<p>There are on average 2 CCTV enforcement vehicles deployed on a daily basis.</p> <p>11,223 PCNs have been issued by these vehicles between 1st Apr 2012 and 31st Mar 2014 for traffic offences</p> <p>The mobile CCTV vehicles have issued a total of 16,025 over the period including PCNs issued for parking contraventions.</p> <p>The answer relates to traffic violations which consist of banned right turns, no entry violations, bus gate contraventions and box junction offences.</p> <p>The council is also trialling three ANPR enabled CCTV vehicles but are not currently using them to enforce</p>

The proposed school was originally to be funded in full by the Building Schools for the Future (BSF) programme which was cancelled in July 2010 shortly after the change in national government.</p> <p>Following cancellation of BSF, the Authority supported the Diocese of London and Twyford High School's application to establish a new secondary School on the site through the free School route. . The Education Funding Agency allocated £18,629,290 of capital funds towards the project with the Council contributing £800,000 (in addition to the site itself) in order to retain the special needs provision which was not funded by the EFA. William Perkin CE High School opened in September 2013 with remaining construction work expected to be completed shortly.</p>
