2.	<b>Update on Crossrail</b>	Crossrail Ltd	For information	<p>Copies of a Crossrail update presentation were available to the meeting.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• More than 90 percent of engineering work for Crossrail/ Elizabeth Line is completed.</li> <li>• The Elizabeth Line is being tested, with rolling stock scheduled to start on the eastbound service from May 2018.</li> <li>• The platform extensions in Ealing Broadway Station are completed.</li> <li>• Transport for London (TfL) will manage and staff Ealing Broadway Station.</li> <li>• Work to the station should be completed by December 2019.</li> <li>• Trains services are scheduled to commence through Ealing from December 2018 with a gradual phased increase until December 2019, when the full route opens for up to twelve services an hour in each direction of the Elizabeth Line.</li> </ul>
2.2)	Carillion are one of the contractors currently working on the development of Ealing Broadway station. What happens next regarding their problems?	Crossrail Ltd	For information	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Carillion is responsible for some work in advance of the main part of the station development.</li> <li>• Network Rail was prepared in advance of Carillion's liquidation.</li> <li>• Crossrail Ltd is working with the liquidators, PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC) and Carillion's staff are continuing their work.</li> </ul>
2.3)	Will the Elizabeth Line be subject to premium pricing?	Crossrail Ltd	For information	Only in certain sections along the line. TfL will set the fares.
2.4)	Will the Elizabeth Line have step free access for wheelchair users?	Crossrail Ltd	For information	Access to trains at Ealing Broadway station will be level to the platform. There will be TfL staff available from the first to the last train to help when a ramp is required.

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2.5)	Can Crossrail Ltd have a look at Acton Town Station for a good example of wheelchair access onto trains?	Crossrail Ltd	For information	To be investigated.
<b>3.</b>	<p><b>Traffic management and parking schemes:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Broughton Road</li> <li>- Arden Road</li> <li>- St Leonard's Road</li> <li>- Windsor Road</li> <li>- Mount Park Road</li> <li>- Mountfield Road</li> <li>- Gordon Road pedestrian crossing</li> <li>- Corfton Road, Eaton Rise and Gordon Road</li> </ul>	Highways	For information	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The junctions of Broughton Road and Arden Road towards Uxbridge Road are to be narrowed and road priority given to vehicles exiting the Home Zone area.</li> <li>• A zebra crossing is proposed to be built in St Leonard's Road near the roundabout with Gordon Road. A second pedestrian crossing is also desired closer to The Avenue.</li> <li>• The carriageway of Windsor Road has been resurfaced; <i>No Through Road</i> signage introduced; new double yellow lines are proposed to replace the existing single yellow lines by the tight corner towards Ealing Broadway Shopping Centre.</li> <li>• A section of single yellow line parking restrictions in Mount Park Road by the junction with Haven Green is proposed to be changed to a double yellow line. A disabled parking bay has been requested in addition.</li> <li>• The existing speed humps along Mountfield Road are to be re-profiled to be less severe. An entry treatment scheme at the junction with Madeley Road will create a kerb build-out and introduce a new cycle lane channel. These changes will be funded by the Ealing Broadway Interchange project.</li> <li>• The proposed zebra crossing in Gordon Road will not proceed and will be replaced by a raised table at the Longfield Avenue junction.</li> <li>• A speed survey for Corfton Road, Eaton Rise and Gordon Road is under consideration to be funded.</li> </ul>
3.2)	Will the existing pedestrian crossing remain in Gordon Road?	Highways	For information	The new raised table will be installed instead of a pedestrian crossing.
3.3)	Ealing Council's long-term management of Gordon Road traffic issues	Highways	For information	Gordon Road and Surrounding Streets (GRASS) Residents' Association are concerned about the road's level of traffic and fear it will get worse with Dicken's Yard commercial traffic.
3.4)	Removing the banned left-hand turn from Longfield Road to Uxbridge Road as local residents oppose the change	Highways	For information	The council believes that the right-hand only turn from Longfield Road to Uxbridge Road has reduced tailbacks.

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3.5)	Left-hand only turns in The Grove to Ealing Broadway Shopping Centre	Highways	For information	After discussions with Ealing Broadway Shopping Centre, additional signage is to be introduced to direct drivers exiting the service road at the rear of the shops located in The Green that they can only turn left towards the shopping centre barriers.
4.	<b>Update on commercial waste collection – time banding</b> - feedback report from Graeme Thomas	Street Services	For information	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There were some successes with waste collection in the Town Centre due to the changes made by the council's contractor, Amey.</li> <li>• The council's communication and warnings worked for commercial businesses'. But, the lack of policing has again led to piles of waste building outside stores at weekends.</li> <li>• Photographs from residents have been provided to the council showing detritus from Starbucks and Maplin stores.</li> </ul>
5.	<b>Update on Perceval House, Town Hall and Ealing Central Library</b>	Economic Regeneration	For information	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Council has approved Galliford Try as its preferred development partner for Perceval House and an initial planning application is expected in summer 2018.</li> <li>• The decant of Perceval House is planned for spring 2019 with the new offices expected to be ready for staff to move into in from spring 2022.</li> <li>• A further consultation about disposing of Victoria Hall in the Town Hall to Mastcraft is to take place. Mastcraft is the council's preferred development partner.</li> <li>• Mastcraft is seeking to submit a planning application by late spring 2018, and this should lead to a start on site in January 2019 and completion in October 2020.</li> <li>• The council is discussing some concerns about the Town Hall proposal with English Heritage.</li> <li>• The existing Ealing Central Library is to close in July and reopen in a new location in November 2018 for a temporary period.</li> </ul>

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6.	<b>Update on Haven Green</b>	Friends of Haven Green	For information	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A letter from the council's legal department has been received by Friends of Haven Green (FoHG).</li> <li>• The electrical sub-station on the Green is to be removed as part of the Crossrail development of Ealing Broadway station.</li> <li>• FoHG can discuss with council officers the issue of the bus lay-by being returned to grass.</li> <li>• FoHG are considering the progress made to date and are keeping an open mind regarding the BBC Carpark situation.</li> </ul>
7.	<b>Ward forum budget</b>	Ward councillors	For information	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A review of the ward forum budget spend from 2014-2018 was provided.</li> <li>• Since 2014, 19 out of 27 recommended projects so far have been completed, totalling £102,620.</li> </ul>
7.2)	Desert to Oasis in Arden Road	Five Roads Forum	For information	The ward forum was thanked for its contribution to the project and was informed that planting was to occur very shortly.
7.3)	Parking restrictions changes in The Knoll, W13	Highways	Open	The meeting agreed for councillors' to seek funds to ensure that emergency vehicles are not prevented from reaching the area marked <i>Fire Entry</i> at the eastern end of The Knoll due to parked vehicles.
