

## **ATTACHMENT FOR FORM APPLYING FOR A SUMMARY LICENCE REVIEW**

On MONDAY 3<sup>rd</sup> MAY 2021 at 18:15hrs, the Metropolitan Police received a call to OSTERLEY PARK ROAD, by a female who said that she had come out of a corner shop and a man believed to be the owner of the shop had assaulted her husband and a man, by stamping on his head. A description of 2 suspects was given and she believed they were both drunk. They were saying 'I love you and I will fuck you'. CAD 5249/03MAY21 refers.

At 18:24hrs, the Metropolitan Police received a call from SAIMA Alarms for a personal attack alarm that had been set off at 61 THE GREEN, SOUTHALL. A commotion could be heard and police were requested. CAD 5339/03MAY21 refers.

Upon police arrival to OSTERLEY PARK ROAD SOUTHALL, both the suspects, one being Mr Harjeet Singh TALWAR, the other his friend and the victim were all present. Mr Harjeet Singh TALWAR is the Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor of JEET FOOD & WINE, 61 THE GREEN, SOUTHALL, UB2 4BL.

It is alleged by the female informant that she was in the corner shop on THE GREEN, SOUTHALL when both suspects were making derogatory comments towards her saying they 'loved her' and wanted to 'fuck her'. The female's husband has overheard these comments and come in to challenge both of the males. An argument has then taken place and the victim who has overheard what has been said to the female has told both the suspects to be more respectful. At this point one of the suspects has punched the victim in his head and Mr Harjeet Singh TALWAR has swiped the victim's legs away with his own foot causing him to fall to the ground. The victim has then been subjected to a violent attack where he was repeatedly kicked, and his head was stamped on by both Mr Harjeet Singh TALWAR and the other suspect. After this, Mr Harjeet Singh TALWAR and the other suspect walked off down OSTERLEY PARK ROAD where they were stopped by police officers.

Both Mr Harjeet Singh TALWAR and the other suspect stated that the incident was actually instigated by the female's husband after he had pushed out at them. They have then retaliated and punched out at him. They said another male has picked up a brick and swung this towards him causing a slight graze on his right hand. Both Mr Harjeet Singh TALWAR and the other suspect were intoxicated and an independent witness corroborated the above account stating he saw both Mr Harjeet Singh TALWAR and the other suspect kicking and stamping on the victim's head.

Both the informant and police officers have stated that Mr Harjeet Singh TALWAR and the other suspect were intoxicated.

The victim who is disabled and was born with one arm, sustained two 1 inch cuts to both eyebrows and was treated by the London Ambulance Service. His injuries were deemed to be non-life threatening and non-life changing and he was treated at the scene. There was no need for him to attend hospital.

On 03/05/2021 at 23:13hrs, the Metropolitan Police received a call from the female victim who had made the initial call at 18:15hrs. She was wanting to report harassment from both Mr Harjeet Singh TALWAR and the other suspect. Police attended the home address of the victim to take a report and

she stated that Mr Harjeet Singh TALWAR and the other suspect who is believed to be his friend have been making sexual gestures on multiple occasions to her over the past two months. They say that they want to 'fuck her' and make sexual gestures with their tongue. They blow her kisses and tell her to get rid of her husband. This behaviour makes the victim feel uncomfortable every time she goes into the shop. CAD 7184/03MAY21 refers.

Enquiries have been made in regards to CCTV. The London Borough of Ealing have no footage of the incident and I contacted the premises licence holder and designated premises supervisor Mr Harjeet Singh TALWAR on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> MAY 2021, who informed me that his CCTV only shows a live visual and doesn't record.

There is police officers body worn camera footage, but this doesn't include the incident, just the aftermath with the arrests of Mr Harjeet Singh TALWAR and the other suspect, plus the allegation by the victim.

Due to the behaviour of the premises licence holder and designated premises supervisor Mr Harjeet Singh TALWAR, the licensing objectives have not been promoted and he is not fit and proper to be the licence holder or the designated premises supervisor of JEET FOOD & WINE. Not only has it been alleged that he has committed a serious criminal offence, but he has also been working in the premises whilst under the influence of alcohol. Not only this but Mr Harjeet Singh TALWAR has also made gestures towards a female and make lewd comments to her. This is not the actions of a responsible licence holder. It is Mr Harjeet Singh TALWAR'S duty to protect the public by ensuring the licensing objectives are promoted. These incidents highlight his total disregard for the licensing objectives.

The Metropolitan Police seek suspension of the premises licence as a necessary and only interim step until determination of the full hearing.

This incident is still a live and ongoing investigation.
