Incidents of shoplifting from businesses have also decreased as a result of educating local businesses and enforcement of anti-social behaviour. An injunction has been approved for a prolific street beggar.
2.2)	<p>The meeting asked several questions regarding local policing. Responses from officers and ward councillors' are noted.</p>	SNT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Any person sleeping rough on the streets in the borough is referred to the charity, St Mungo's. With partnership support, the SNT have arrested a prolific offender and related people targeting school students for robbery. The management of Ealing Broadway Station would have to decide if they wanted to install signage to make commuters aware that they can make any donations through helplines, rather than providing loose change to street beggars.

Council updates: Ealing Libraries	LBE Libraries	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ealing Council will hold a 12-week public consultation from mid-February on a proposal to change seven branch libraries around the borough into community managed libraries. The council's Library Strategy, will be decided in July. Central Ealing Library is still closed, but likely to re-open in the summer.
3.2)	Ealing Town Hall	LBE Economic Regeneration	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A decision is pending by the council's Cabinet regarding the development and refurbishment Ealing Town Hall and Victoria Hall. There are proposals from two community groups for the Town Hall to be given over as an asset for community use. The Charity Commission report is yet to be published. Save Ealing Centre have organised for lawyers to write to the council concerning the proposed lease of the Town Hall.
3.3)	Electoral Boundary changes	The Local Government Boundary Commission for England	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Local Government Boundary Commission for England - is reviewing the electoral arrangements for Ealing. Ealing's Boundaries Panel has agreed to recommend to the Boundaries Commission that the number of wards increases from 23 to 24 leading to an increase in councillors from 69 to 70. It is possible that some current areas of Ealing Broadway ward are to be lost.
4.	Update on Haven Green	Friends of Haven Green	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Friends of Haven Green (FoHG) met with Crossrail to discuss the frontage of the Ealing Broadway Station. Following the initial approval of plans in 2014, there are now new plans that include public realm improvements. The council is to re-instate parts of Haven Green in the summer of 2020 following the FoHG outstanding legal case. Crossrail state they want to work with FoHG on public realm improvements by the Green.

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5.2)	Wells House and Bakers House alley gates		Gates for the carpark off Western road and Wells House and Bakers House alleyways have been installed. The issue regarding the carpark gate lock is to be resolved following a fire risk assessment.
5.3)	Five Roads Home Zone vehicle access/ egress at junctions	Ward councillors	The issues with vehicles accessing Denmark Road from St Leonard's Road and Arden Road are to be investigated.
