Reforms to Houses in Multiple Occupation (HMO) licensing</p> <p>Following legislation introduced earlier this year from 1 October 2018, mandatory HMO licensing is being extended to almost all Houses in Multiple Occupation (HMOs) that are occupied by five or more people, from 2 or more separate households and where there is some sharing of facilities.</p> <p>The licensing scheme was previously restricted to properties that were three or more storeys in height.</p> <p>New rules will also come into force setting minimum size requirements for bedrooms in HMOs to prevent overcrowding. 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	<p>Crossrail project. This includes the construction of the platform extensions which were recently brought into use as well as installing new equipment on the platforms. Advance works have also been undertaken to put in foundations on the platforms for the new footbridge, lifts and staircases. Since much of this work is close to the operational railway it needs to take place at night when the trains are not running, which limits the hours of work. As a result, the work has provided Network Rail’s contractors with some challenges which is why the new station building has not been constructed as soon as had originally been expected. However, Network Rail has assured us that the new station building, footbridge, lifts and stairs to the platforms will be open in time for the commencement of the full Elizabeth line service in December 2019. Network Rail is not yet in a position to provide more detail of the programme of works but this will be published when it is available.</p> <p>MTR on behalf of Transport for London (TfL) has taken over responsibility for the management of the station from Great Western Railway. In addition, on 20 May TfL Rail took responsibility for the stopping service between Paddington and Heathrow (previously the Heathrow Connect service). Oyster and other contactless cards can now be used to Heathrow, with many fares slightly lower than the previous Heathrow Connect service, although in most cases it will still cost more than travelling to zone 6. TfL Rail has also introduced new trains on the service between Paddington and Hayes &amp; Harlington.</p>	<p>who is unable to attend this meeting</p>		
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	<p>The Elizabeth line will be launched in December this year with services commencing through the tunnels under central London between Paddington and Abbey Wood, although at that stage passengers from Southall will still need to change trains at Paddington to make use of this service.
