

Over-occupied flats/overcrowding/no storage area – the council introduced a private sector licencing scheme in 2017. There are currently over 6,000 licensed properties across the borough (703 are in Southall Broadway and 1,022 in Southall Green). Any person wishing to verify whether a property is licensed can search Ealing’s applications webpage: <https://pam.ealing.gov.uk/online-applications/> or contact the property licensing team on 0208 825 9512 or email prslicensing@ealing.gov.uk. The licensing register lists the name of the licence holder and states the maximum number of permitted occupants. To report an unlicensed property you can contact the property licensing team (tel: 0208 825 9512/ e: prslicensing@ealing.gov.uk) or complete an online form: [Illegal outhouse/ House in multiple occupation](#). 

This is an aspiration for us all.

Ealing Council to work with other councils to see how they tackle the problem. Fly tipping is recognised as an issue nationally and across London – Ealing Council is a member of London Councils who commissioned a report on understanding and tackling fly tipping in London in July 2018 and will be leading on some trials to see what works to change behaviour.

Free bulky waste pick up outweighing cost of picking up the fly tipping.

The council’s research to date suggests that providing a ‘free’ bulky waste collection will not prevent fly tipping. This means that council tax payers will end up paying for both services - nothing is ‘free’ of cost; only ‘free’ at the point of service.

Transient community – as well as licensing, enforcement of littering and fly tipping, and supporting the cleaner Southall campaign, the council will introduce additional content about waste and recycling options that can be delivered as part of council run ESOL
