1. Panel Work Programme

2. Visits

On Thursday 19 October, the Vice-chair of the Panel, Councillor Seema Kumar visited the Hestia Refuge located in the borough and was met by Seem Alsasa, Service Manager and Abigail Ampofo, Group Manager, Hestia Ealing and Harrow Domestic Abuse Service and was shown around the home. Councillor Kumar also met a service user who spoke about her experiences of living in the refuge and of trying to establish a life for herself and her children free from harm.

That afternoon the Chair, Councillor Joanna Camadoo, Councillor Seema Kumar and Councillor Kamaljit Kaur Nagpal visited Southall Black Sisters and heard from Pragna Patel, Director and Meena Patel, Operations Manager about the work they do to support women and children experiencing domestic and other forms of gender-related violence, and in particular work with women with complex needs. The councillors were shown around the SBS offices and met with the advocacy workers who told them about the cases they were currently working on.
